PURPOSE OF THE POST:

The incumbent will provide additional operational support with technical input to the implementation and field level monitoring of the education emergency and early recovery activities in Gaza. Strengthen the integration with education emergency and early recovery programming through Education Cluster/Sector-lead approach in Jerusalem/Ramallah, in close collaboration with cluster co-lead Save the Children.

THE JPO WILL:

- Provide technical and operational support for Gaza and West Bank to strengthen the capacity of national and local institutions to respond to and coordinate emergency education and Early Recovery interventions, and integration of emergency preparedness and response in national plans.
- Support the Coordinator on the inter-agency assessments of the situation in the education sector within a broad framework of education and child protection, including school safety and security, psychosocial issues, teaching and learning processes, Early Childhood Care and Development, as part of an integrated, harmonized and coordinated holistic response that demonstrates results and impact for children and adolescents;
- Assist in cluster coordination with the Save the Children Alliance at Jerusalem level, to ensure an effective and coordinated response to the needs in the education sector, including joint assessments, planning, and coordination of information management and CAP (Education Section) review work.

Work experience: For candidates with Mater Degree preferably 2 years of experience, for Bachelor's Degree minimal 3 years of work experience related to education programme implementation under regular or emergency situation
