### **Objective of the WHO Programme/Department:**

To support high-burden countries to ensure evidence-based policies and strategies are in place to achieve universal access to high quality health services for MNCAH, and increase coverage and quality of effective MNCAH interventions among pregnant women, newborns, children and adolescents and create mechanisms to measure the impact of those strategies.

### **Assignment Summary:**

Under the direct supervision of the Coordinator of the Policy, Planning and Programme team the JPO will assist to MCA's work in supporting countries to implement their commitments to the Global Strategy for Women's and Children's Health, in particular in relation to quality of care for maternal, newborn, child and adolescent health. The JPO will also assist MCAs work in delivering the 'plus package' of adolescent health that will be incorporated into the introduction of HPV vaccine and using it to strengthen national adolescent sexual and reproductive health programmes. The JPO would ideally be assigned to a country office for his second/third year of his/her assignment to continue this work at country level and to gain insight into two levels of the organization.

# **Duties, Responsibilities and Output expectations**

In particular, the JPO will assist in supporting WHO's regional and country offices in the following areas:

- implementation of the commitments to the UN Secretary General's Global Strategy in countries
- development and preparation of quality of care training packages
- development and testing of indicators
- collection of indicators in countries

The JPO will further assist in supporting countries in the delivery of the 'plus package' of adolescent health that will be incorporated into the introduction of HPV vaccine and in using it to strengthen national adolescent sexual and reproductive health programmes, in particular the JPO will assist in:

- definining the "plus package" of adolescent health that will be incorporated into the introduction of the HPV vaccine
- the ground work needed at country-level to become eligible for support from GAVI, specifically support to pilot operations research studies to test the feasibility of delivering the "plus package" with the vaccine
- planning, implementing and monitoring the delivery of the "plus package" delivered with the HPV vaccine and follow up to it.
